

Q1 How likely is it that you would recommend attending the Curriculum Institute event to your colleagues?


Q2 Overall, how would you rate the Curriculum Institute event?





Q5 General Session 2: CCCCO Curriculum Updates /Training - This general session was impactful to my work.





Q7 General Session 4: Student Panel, GE and Student Perspectives - This general session was impactful to my work.



Q8 General Session 5: More of the 411 on AB 1111 aka Common Course Numbering - This general session was impactful to my work.



Q9 How did you attend the hybrid event?






Q10 Please select the top 3 breakout topics that was most impactful to you.











Q24 Was the Zoom Events Test Session useful? Did you know how to navigate the platform such as finding the sessions, joining a session, and downloading the materials?



Q25 What is your employment status?





Q27 What is your sexual orientation? (Please check all that apply.)





Q28 What sex were you assigned at birth or is on your original birth certificate?


